GOALS

3-month	1-year	10-year
Demonstrate that massive savings can be achieved by coordinating water, tree planting and sewer efforts currently being managed separately.	Get commitments from the Cleveland Tree Plan, NEORSD and Cleveland Water Department to coordinate, save \$300M.	Save an additional \$200M for residents through introduction of water/sewer technologies standard in other cities but not being used in Cleveland.

7 water/sewer districts plus Ohio/Federal EPA are providing comparisons to Cleveland. Other cities want to help, not compete, with Cleveland.

Cleveland NAACP	On average, Ward 5 residents pay 12% of income just for water/sewer bills. We want to alleviate that water/sewer burden and reduce liens on low-income households.



Needs

What resources do you need to achieve the 3-month goal in your aspiration area?

Willingness of Cleveland Tree Plan, NEORSD and Cleveland Water Department to coordinate their plans and engineers to achieve \$300M in synergies.

Strong support from CLE Rising, Plain Dealer, NAACP, Cleveland and Gund Foundations, etc. (many of whom are already aware of the savings potential).

Outside engineering firms with the technology already successful in other cities.

The Federal and Ohio EPAs say they will share their expertise that helped achieve huge savings in many cities, e.g., NYC - \$1.5B, Cincy \$200M, Columbus \$800M, Indy \$700M
